For the past 15 years, Student Hubs has worked in partnership with students, universities, and community organisations to deliver social action activities which not only create meaningful impact for students and communities across the academic year, but which also develop a new generation of graduate leaders who can create lasting impact in the future.

Our activities are place-based, with a focus on deeply understanding the needs of the students and communities who engage with our activities and participate within them. As a result, our expertise lies within crafting student opportunities which support university students to build their confidence, develop their skills and experiences, and enhance their belonging, wellbeing, and university experience, whilst listening to and understanding the social and environmental issues of the community they engage and support within these opportunities. The higher education landscape has changed dramatically in the past five years, and so have the needs of students and the focus of providers during this time. To meet both the needs of students and our university partners, Student Hubs' model of partnerships is changing. We want to be more agile in our approach, and scaffold support for a range of interventions to meet an institution's strategic ambitions, budget needs, timescales, and plans for growth.










Allow us to reintroduce ourselves: we're Student Hubs, and for the past 15 years we've delivered high-quality social action activities for university students.



Being an **active citizen** is important as it supports our sense of purpose and belonging in the world. To us, being an active citizen means that students and graduates feel they can imagine a future that is better than it is now, and that they are equipped with the 'skills for life' to play an active part in designing that future. 'Skills for life' are the core competencies to enact change, and they include skills like communication, teamwork, leadership, and resilience, along with confidence and a strong sense of belonging.

We know the best way to achieve all of this is by **working in partnership** with universities. Universities are fundamental in making this happen. They represent a transformational time and space in a student's life, when they are primed and open to new ideas, connecting with peers at a similar stage as them, and are in a safe environment where they can try things with less pressure and fail with a safety net. Universities play a key role in shaping what these experiences look like, what's available, and how a student might engage with them.

Case Study: Student

On skills for life

"Initially I felt nervous...but soon found my feet and the more comfortable I felt, the more myself and the girls could open up to one another and make the club as beneficial to everyone as possible. I feel more confident in my ability to be a leader and to communicate with those around me"

On confidence

"My involvement with the Hub this year inspired me to run for a role on the committee... If you had told me a year ago that I would be standing up making a speech as to why I could be good for the role and what I have to offer I would have laughed, but due to the Hub I felt comfortable and confident in giving the speech and confident that I had more to offer to the Hub."

On wellbeing

"[The Hub] has really connected me to the local community as I feel I have learned more about the people that live here, the challenges they face and the support they may need." "My involvement has impacted my mental wellbeing as I feel so supported and able to communicate with those in the Hub as well as the teachers I have connected to."

On critical engagement

"I had limited understanding of the issue prior to volunteering with the Hub, whereas now I feel like I know a lot more about the community and its needs and how everyone can get involved and make a difference."

On university experience

"The Hub has massively impacted my experience at university as I have met so many amazing people and made so many new friends... I think the project has been so positive and added so much joy to my university life."

"I went to [a local primary school] to lead an after school club with a handful of Year 6 girls that needed support in their transition to secondary school... When I was in Year 6 I remembered how nervous I was to go into secondary school and I recognise how I too could have benefited from a club like this one"



83% of students agreed participating improved their ability to adapt and overcome challenges (**resilience**) and **81%** agreed that it improved their ability to work with others to make change (**teamwork**)



88% of students agreed participating improved their **confidence** in approaching challenges




78% of students agreed that participating enhanced their

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Case Study: Embed

From 2014-2023, Kingston Hub sat within the Careers and Employability team at Kingston University, primarily delivering Community Engaged Learning opportunities which are embedded within the teaching and learning curriculum. We also delivered a discrete range of volunteering projects working with the local community.

Our partnership supported:

- The Careers team, working with 600+ students a year to further the University's aim of making employability experiences accessible and embedded in the university curriculum;
- Academics at Kingston University, with our team using their community expertise to facilitate community partnerships which meet assessment and learning goals across all faculties of the university;
- The Kingston community, providing opportunities to engage with students through tutoring, mentoring, and other activities;
- Students at Kingston University, including our committee of student leaders who receive bespoke training.

The opportunities Student Hubs creates for students and graduates [are] unusual. In building their partnerships they get under the skin of the institution and understand it, rather than having a one-size-fits-all model. The values of Student Hubs' work and organisation are shared in aligning with the university's values, and your team lives the values in the work they deliver.
